

# Ontario Command Remembrance Video Contest

The Remembrance Video Contest is now part of the Ontario Command Youth Education program. It is meant to foster an understanding of the sacrifices made on our behalf by the many men and women in World Wars I and II and the Korean War. To this day, many brave men and women put personal security at risk in the name of peace and humanity in places like Bosnia, Cyprus, Haiti, East Timor, Afghanistan, etc.

The entry must be in the form of a Video submission.

## When is the Contest Held?

The video contest is held every year. All submissions must be emailed to: Ontario Provincial Command at [videos@on.legion.ca](mailto:videos@on.legion.ca) by 6:00 p.m. December 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year.

## Categories

The contest is divided into two categories:

**Category V1** (Individual Entry) Grades 4 – 8 and Grades 9 - 12

**Category V2** (Group Entry) Grades 4 – 8 and Grades 9 - 12

## What should my video contain?

Create a 3 - 4 minute Remembrance video (including credits) to explain what Remembrance means to you and why it is important for young people to carry forth the “Torch of Remembrance”. The music you use in your video should be original or creative commons, or created using YouTube Audio Swap.

## How to Enter: Video Submissions

1. Upload the video to your YouTube account.
2. Fill out the Video Entry Form (pdf)
3. Group Entries must provide one Entry Form completed by either the teacher or the leader of the group, plus the group consent form.
4. Email your Video Link and completed Entry Form (plus group consent form, if required) to [videos@on.legion.ca](mailto:videos@on.legion.ca) by 6:00 p.m. December 1<sup>st</sup>.

## Rules and Regulations

The following information outlines the rules and regulations for the Ontario Command Remembrance video competition:

1. Video contests include **Video 1** - Individual Entry & **Video 2** - Group Entry.
2. Entries will be between 3-4 minutes in length (including credits).
3. Video 1 (V1) submissions will only be accepted as an individual entry. No joint or group efforts from students within Grades 4 – 12.
4. All video submissions will be judged on originality, research, emotion, intergenerational message, quality, etc.
5. All videos will be judged at Ontario Command level only. The first, second and third place videos in each video category will be awarded prizes and posted on the Ontario Command website for a period of one year.
6. Students may enter both the Video 1 (V1) and Video 2 (V2) categories but may only submit one entry per contest. **The Group Entry must have every participating student's name, signature and parental consents.**
7. When national symbols are used, Canadian symbols must be preeminent.
8. Students who have been out of the educational system for more than two consecutive years are ineligible to compete in either Video Contest.
